
Parent engagement in student learning has been proven to have strong links to improved academic outcomes for students. A leading education researcher, John Hattie, has found the following evidence in his analysis of 1000's of research articles on this topic.

Among the greatest influences on student learning from the home is parental involvement. On the chart to the right, you see the positive effect of 0.51 the parental engagement has on student achievement. John Hattie has said the following:

"The importance of parents

Parents are not "first teachers" but "first learners" – as the parents learn, so do their children. Parental expectation about learning is among the most powerful home influences, and the home needs to promote a "language and love of learning".

This means parents talk to their children about their learning at school and home. This also means they enjoy the struggle, failures and successes when learning together, and set fair boundaries to take on increased challenges and learning safely.



This might mean being clear about what success looks like for a child cleaning their room. It might mean allowing multiple opportunities to succeed and talking about errors and failure as opportunities to learn."



A New generation

While our children share our DNA, they are not our carbon copies. Their interests and opinions are their own, encouraging individuality creates an environment for growth.

Resist the urge to Hover

While our instinct can be to always hold their hands this can be stifling. The same way we don't like our boss watching over our shoulder children need space to work things out for themselves.
